Bryan Beauchamp is a consultant and writer with over 40 years experience in stakeholder communication.

Mr. Beauchamp studied economics at York University, Atkinson College, and was a partner in the pioneering audio-visual firm, Creative Sight & Sound before joining Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce in 1974. There he served as the bank's Public Affairs Manager for 10 years before leaving in 1983 to establish his own consultancy in "stakeholder communication for successful St. Paul's

outcomes". Since then his clients have included a variety of prominent individuals, firms and non-profit organizations.

Bryan Beauchamp, a long-time member of the Canadian Centre for Ethics and Corporate Policy and of Mensa Canada, now consults on strategic governance and ethical conduct in a changing global environment.
