THE PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD


A reading from ROMANS 11:1-2A, 29-32

APOSTLES' CREED (Please Stand) (BAS Pg. 189)

Celebrant Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say,

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. Restore to wholeness whatever is broken by human sin, in our lives, in our nation, and in the world;

You have declared your power among the peoples.
