### Ask & Imagine: Insights from your Incumbent: Rev. Bonnie Skerritt June 2022



"like a newborn baby, desire the pure milk of the word. Nourished by it, you will grow into salvation, since you have tasted that the Lord is good." 1 Peter 2:2-3

Summertime greetings! As I write this letter, we have now moved into the "green season". Clearly, our landscape is green all around us and we can rejoice in the beauty of this, but it is also the long, green season in the Church. We are now in the Season after Pentecost and the liturgical colour of green will not change again for a

considerable length of time. The church selected the colour green for this season because, just like spring and summer, it is a time of growth, spiritual growth.

We have now enjoyed most of the principal feasts of the liturgical year where we focus on the big events in Christianity. We have walked the journey from the advent of Jesus' birth to the scene in the humble manger, through Epiphany, Lent and Holy Week. We have celebrated the glory of the resurrection on Easter morn and journeyed further through the 50 days of Eastertide to the powerful scene in a house in Jerusalem where the Holy Spirit appeared as wind and flame, filling the followers of Jesus with her power to go out into the world and proclaim the Good News. This first part of the liturgical year has essentially planted spiritual seeds and fertilized them. Or as St Peter suggests, we have been nourished by the pure milk of the word. Now it is time for growth!

If you are wondering about spiritual growth in your life, St. Paul provides us with a way to know about this through the Fruits of the Spirit. He tells us to look for these "fruits" to be present in your life: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. I am not sure if I have ever met anyone who displayed all of the Fruits, all the time. I certainly have known many people whose lives clearly bear most of the Fruits of the Spirit.

My challenge for you this summer is to select one of the Fruits and make it your focus for the season. It is probably good to select something that you have difficulty with and choose to work on that. For example, if you get frustrated easily, work on being the most patient version of yourself that you can be. Look up a Bible verse that can help you with this (I am happy to lend a helping hand in this), and/or ask the Holy Spirit to assist you with showing patience. When you notice that you are succeeding, be joyful! If you notice that you are having difficulty, be gentle and kind to yourself. You will get there!

Whichever Fruit you choose to focus on in this Season after Pentecost, may it be a time of good spiritual growth for you, and may the Lord continue to uphold you on your journey.



As you read this, the Induction or Celebration of New Ministry for The Rev. Bonnie Skerritt will have taken place. There was a time when such a service of welcome to a new parish was carried out within a short time of a priest's arrival. It has been over a year now since a new ministry between priest and people started—given the realities of COVID, many parishes now are able to hold this special service.

Whenever I was called to a new parish, I made the drive to our Synod Office chapel for a short service of 'Institution' presided over by the diocesan bishop. bishop says such words: 'Accept this charge, which is mine and thine....' Each time was a humbling moment as the reality of change was felt as I knelt before the bishop for his blessing. After all, the bishop is the chief pastor and I was sent out knowing that it is not all about me—I was a part of a large diocesan family, a worldwide church, and I was a priest under a bishop for we are an episcopal church. That was, and is, comforting and a strength to me over the years. Then, a time after arrival at my new parish, I was inducted—the keys to the church, chalice & paten, and Bible ceremonially given me and the Eucharist celebrated by the bishop, a mandate read by the Regional Dean. It was a celebration.

So it is for the Rev. Bonnie and all of us. As with every change of priest, there is a loss, with special memories of the previous priest or priests. In some places, one who served years ago will be talked about with great esteem. How important it was for me to get on with the new parish, delicately maintain some relationship with a few who had become our good friends in a former parish and also stay clear of that parish and the new priest. I hope that whoever has followed me, has no great horror story of 'he never left'. I have served just over 47 years in parish ministry (35 plus before retirement) so I have known five of your former priests. Each brought gifts, and many parishioners appreciated such gifts. You shared a ministry together. There was sadness felt when each left and a wondering when a new one came. How we as priests appreciated the welcomes as we, too, experienced emotions in leaving a parish and its people we had walked with through the times and seasons of life. New seasons were to come.

Now we have another official new beginning, even though it began over a year ago. In this season of light and nature's wonder (despite its destruction at times), may we give thanks for what has been, celebrate what is to be, and move forward. It is a challenging time for many parishes, not just St. Paul's.

The Celebration of New Ministry is not just about the priest, but includes you, the people of God here. I know I was blessed by many faithful parishioners who offered support and their quiet service in Christ's name. May God bless the Rev. Bonnie & this parish in this new season.

# WARDEN'S WALK: By Barb Truax

Summer greetings to all!!! We certainly had a very cool and wet spring! However, now, as we look about us we can see nature's renewal in all its glory.

St. Paul's has enjoyed some very successful events this Spring – such as the <u>Infinitely More Concert</u> whose proceeds were in support of Ukraine, <u>Spring Thaw Dinner and Auction</u> and the new <u>Spring in Bloom Market</u>. These are reported in more detail throughout this newsletter.

As I write this article, we at St. Paul's are in a transitional period. At our Vestry meeting in February we were faced with the fact that there would be no wardens to serve for the upcoming year. This was due in part to the unique situation that the sitting wardens had been serving for many years through some very difficult times.

After an intensive search we realized we were in danger of being a noncompliant corporation. To cover the immediate period, two individuals, Barb Truax and Max Radiff stepped forward as interim wardens. Subsequently, it was determined that we request the Diocese for the assistance of an administrator to oversee the church in the short term.

As of May 24<sup>th</sup>, Walter Howell has been appointed as our administrator along with two additional diocesan people to assist with congregational development. These three, along with Rev. Bonnie will operate with a Board of Management of church parishioners for up to a term of one year.

This Wardens' Walk column is a report to you of the parish administration over the past three months and how we have worked with the congregation's assistance to carry forward some of the critical issues we were facing.

- 1. Valerie James-Call, our present Administrative Assistant, would be retiring June 24, 2022 after 20 years.
- 2. Don Brohm advised the Advisory Board that he would be retiring as of December 31, 2022 after many, many years as Property Manager.
- 3. Rev. Bonnie is a new priest having joined us May 2, 2021 during the pandemic and church closures.
- 4. The financial health of the church requires planning.
- 5. After the pandemic and with the reopening of the church what congregation will remain?
- 6. What is the future of our major fundraisers –i.e the Strawberry Supper and the Fair Booth?

In response to these major issues, the following have been resolved:

- 1. We are pleased to announce that a new Administrative Assistant, Cathy Rickard, has been hired as of May 24, 2022.
- 2. To replace Don Brohm, a threesome of parishioners have agreed to job shadow Don from June to December and then to assume control in 2023.
- 3. Rev Bonnie celebrated her one year anniversary with us on May 1st this year, and has become more and more familiar with our idiosyncrasies and habits while she directs us on our future spiritual journey.
- 4. Stewardship development has begun towards a more sustainable financial plan.
- 5. Our congregation has returned on a smaller scale, but with hopes that as more and more people become comfortable with larger crowds, we will recover.
- 6. Several stewardship fundraisers have successfully been held as you can read in this issue and we welcome back the Strawberry Supper in an abbreviated form for this year. Unfortunately we have had to say goodbye to the Fair Booth after so many years due to an aging congregation. We are saddened by this.

We hope that all will continue to support the work of St. Paul's as we work through the next tentative chapters of our history, allowing us to remain a vibrant member of our community.

We wish each and every one of you a healthy and enjoyable summer season.

We will be putting together another collection of personal bags for Women's Resources at the end of June. We always accept items for women and children and these can be left in the office or on the sewing machine in the library.


We still meet at 1:00 p.m. every Thursday. Come out anytime for coffee and conversation.



# **PAG (Pre-Authorized Giving)**

Dear St. Paul's Parishioner,

Since the beginning of the Covid outbreak, with relatively few opportunities to attend Church in person, St. Paul's Church has seen a significant reduction in giving, and few opportunities to get together for fundraisers.

This has resulted in an expected deficit in income over expenditure for 2022 and 2023 for St. Paul's parish.

It is appreciated that many parishioners have stayed away from Church during the Covid pandemic, but your donations are still required to support the work of your Church.

One way to address this situation is to invite parishioners to commit to regular donations using Pre-Authorized Giving (PAG) which means deciding on an affordable sum and authorizing your bank to make regular monthly payments directly to St. Paul's.

Further information on - Why and How - you can make an arrangement for PAG is detailed in a leaflet, which is reproduced on the next page.

### Why PAG? ~ FAQ's

Like any community or family Saint Paul's has ongoing financial needs that require regular support. Because the Church is important to us, we are called in faith to make a financial commitment to enable the ongoing ministry of the Realm of God.

HOW DOES PAG ASSIST ST. PAUL'S? Those who choose PAG assist St. Paul's by providing a consistent and dependable cash flow throughout the year. This allows better budgeting and ongoing cash flow management.

HOW DO I SIGN UP FOR PAG? Signing up for PAG couldn't be easier. First, prayerfully consider how much you wish to give to the mission and ministry of St. Paul's. Next, fill out the form on the opposite side of this brochure and Insert the entire form/brochure into the supplied envelope. Bring it into the church office, put it on the collection plate or mail it. That's it! You will receive an acknowledgement of your gift. Tax receipts are issued once per year in February.

HOW DO I GIVE EXTRA? ~ To support specific initiatives, acknowledge feasts (Easter), give a thanksgiving or memorial, or a specific appeal you can either increase your monthly PAG or use an envelope for extra givings at any time.

#### HOW DO I DECIDE HOW MUCH TO GIVE?

As giving is a personal issue there is no right amount. Here are a few ideas to consider.

- Weekly Envelope ~ If you have been giving through a weekly envelope, multiply your weekly giving by 52 (even if you missed a week here or there), next divide it by 12 - that is your monthly giving. If you are able, consider stretching your gift by the cost of living. Giving, like living, is a matter of faith, not finances.
- Proportionate Giving ~ Is a gift that should reflect our relationship with God. When considering how God has blessed us, we should look at our whole life, our health, our families, our jobs, etc. As our awareness of God's goodness in our lives grows, many people find it easy to increase their giving. This is possible because they can clearly see the difference between needs and wants. (excerpt from Parish Manual, Diocese of Toronto)
- · Stewardship Office, Diocese of Toronto recommends that we consider giving the equivalent of one hour of work at our regular wage each week. Example - \$35/hour x 52 weeks ÷12 = a monthly donation of \$151.00

CAN I DESIGNATE MY GIVINGS? Yes! Most parishioners designate their givings for "general" purposes, but the attached form allows the designation of up to two additional goals. Common goals include:






