Ask & Imagine: Insights from your Incumbent Rev. Bonnie Skerritt June '23



Greetings!

Recently I had the opportunity to attend the Clergy Conference, the first one in-person since 2019. It was wonderful to be with colleagues from across the diocese, especially to meet in person those whom I had only met via Zoom so far.

It can be easy when we talk to folks from different parishes or different

denominations, both clergy and laity, to start to compare St. Paul's with others. Sometimes these comparisons rob us of the joy of enjoying the bounty and goodness that we already have. Truth be told, there are others looking at St. Paul's and wishing that they had something that we have!

For some time now, the diocese has been mostly concerned with two things: bums in pews and envelopes in the plates. I was pleased to hear at the conference that the notion of looking at other ways to measure the health of a parish is starting to be looked at. I think that this is a good exercise for each of us to do too- to practice a discipline of gratitude in relation to our parish and, indeed, all aspects of our lives.

Yes, it is true that by these former metrics, St. Paul's is not as rich as it once was. However, when we take time to really count the blessings that have been bestowed upon us as a parish, we find that we are rich in many other ways. For example, what price can be put on the loving community that we share? Or what price can be put on having a place dedicated to worshipping Christ in a way that makes sense to us as Anglicans? To have our altar, our windows, our music, our liturgy? To us, our community and our building are priceless; they are beloved gifts from God.

While I pray that all of you have many opportunities to spend quality time with family and friends this Summer, I also pray that you do not forget your parish during this time. Your year-round support of time, talent and treasure helps to make St. Paul's the kind of parish where good ministry happens in all seasons.

Over the late Spring and Summer, the lectionary moves us from the life of Christ to his teachings with a focus on his ministry. Our liturgical colour changes as well to green as this is a time of spiritual growth for us. I leave you with these Bible verses to help support your spiritual growth over the Summer:

"Therefore, my beloved brothers and sisters, be steadfast, immovable, always excelling in the work of the Lord because you know that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:58, NRSV)

On that path, the call of the falls and river beckoned us onward. We reached them and the very smooth rocks along the shore brought smiles as we skipped them across the river---so flat they were and they danced across the water. CHURCH PROPERTY UPDATE

Don Brohm, Church Property Manager assisted by Ray Marshall and Don Chase

As reported in the March 2023 Grapevine all our Tenants are up to date on rents and may we say; GOD BLESS each one of them.

In the March Grapevine as well, we spoke about damage to the Church roof and Hall eavestrough that had pulled away due to ice build up; this has now been repaired.

The a/c covers have been removed for summertime and the bottom portion of the lexan covering the stained glass windows in the Church has been removed for the summer.

The last kitchen inspection by Dyson found two deficiencies that needed attention. (1) Suppression bottle due for 12 year hydrostatic test and pull station required updating to current standards. This work has been completed at the time of this report. Our kitchen rinse sinks taps required new valve inserts as old were hard to turn off and this has been done as well.

32 Glenelg upper Apt required a new ceiling fan and 38 Glenelg upper Apt had a blocked drained; this has been repaired as well.

We have greased the bearings and the electric motor on the Piper Organ blower.

We have a new tree coming for the Courtyard that can be decorated with Christmas lights and it will save the problem of finding a tree every year and having it installed around the end of November or very early December during the wet and cold.

Your Outreach Committee met on June 4, 2023 as we continue to try to be the voice and hands of our Lord Jesus' love in our world, on behalf of St. Paul's.

<u>Stamp Out Poverty</u>: thanks to many contributions from the parish, we have been able to send another large box of stamps to Oxfam. Please continue to collect.

<u>Queen Victoria School</u>: we delivered some shoes, skates and socks to the students. Thanks to the Tai Chi Club for the skates and socks. We appreciate your support. We will resume collection of needed items for the schools in the fall.

<u>Incontinence Supplies</u>: at the request of the Salvation Army, we were able to donate 9 cases of adult supplies thanks to \$210 in donations from the congregation plus \$168 from Outreach funds.

<u>Spring Outreach Service</u>: Peter Mentis from Faithworks delivered an informative and heartfelt sermon concerning the valuable outreach ministry of Faithworks in our diocese. Following the service he toured APCH as a new Faithworks partner.

<u>Food Cupboard</u>: we have received the OK from our insurance company and the town bylaw dept. The committee approved our next steps which involve meeting with Diane Stecher to prepare and cost a design to be worked on by Diane, Rev. Bonnie and Gail Payne. We will then present these to the Management Committee.

A Governance plan for Outreach was presented by Gail and approved, with one small correction.


THE GRAPEVINE (our quarterly newsletter to you)
