Ask & Imagine: Insights from your Incumbent Rev. Bonnie Skerritt Sept 2024



Greetings!

One of the hymns on my long list of "favourite hymns" is "Come In, Come In and Sit Down". It repeatedly says the words "you are a part of the family" and "we are a part of the family", while listing a whole host of people. Basically, by the end of the song it has listed everyone, because everyone is a child of God's and welcome to join in the family.

This notion of a church community as a family is one that I truly cherish. It is one of the first things that I learned from the priest that hired me to be

a Children & Youth Director thirteen years ago, and it is something that I have seen the reality of over and over again, in a variety of parishes. While the positive aspects of family-life are clear within the church, such as being supportive in times of illness and crisis, and sharing times of joy and celebration together, we are not always prepared for the darker side of family life to find its way into a church community. This darker side includes heated disagreements, petty jealousies and gossiping. Left unchecked, small slights can lead to more destructive behaviour and breaks in the group.

At St. Paul's we must guard against such negativity by firstly remembering the old adage often attributed to St. Augustine, "the church is a hospital for sinners not a museum for saints". We also need to consider the Fruits of the Spirit and ask ourselves if we are displaying these (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control).

All of us have imperfections, some little, some larger, that we are working on with the Lord's help. However, when we come together to offer what gifts we have to the Lord to use in the building up of the kingdom, and approach one another as brothers and sisters with the grace and love of Christ, we will find that our family can gather around the table each Sunday for a holy meal in peace and harmony. And as we continue to do this week after week, I pray that we may continue to welcome new members of the family to join us in being family to one another, and everything that this involves.

The Canon's Corner: The Rev. Canon Greg Physick Sept '24



Here we are, shaking your heads for September is upon us. Where did summer go? The Collect for an early September Sunday reads: *Stir up, O Lord, the wills of your faithful people, that richly bearing the fruit of good works, we may by you be richly rewarded....* Many Anglicans of a certain age recall a variation of that prayed on is called 'The Sunday Next Before Advent' in our Book of Common Prayer It was often called 'Stir -Up Sunday' for many ingredients for the Christmas pudding were about to be stirred up—as was all the excitement of Advent and of course Christmas itself. The change is found in our Book of Alternative Services, while parish-

es who use the Book of Common Prayer and lections will pray it on the Sunday familiar to many.

I was a priest introducing the then new BAS of 1985. We heard (and still hear after 39 years) the complaints and one change that brought about comments was the change of Sundays for the above Collect. The emotional ties of 'Stir up Sunday' were heartfelt, as were, and are, the ties to the language of The Book of Common Prayer dating back to its first edition, 1549. (Most will have forgotten but the Canadian revision in 1962 also brought about various complaints.)

My pastoral mind heard the feelings—I will always think of 'Ted', when the collect noted is prayed. Ted was a faithful Anglican and gifted choir member. To his credit, he and I discussed his thoughts and he never left his beloved church due to the change of the collect's timing.

So since 1985 September holds Stir-up Sunday. Yes, January 1st begins each Calendar New Year and Advent begins each Church New Year, yet September finds us in a type of new year too: from the new school year to many fall activities that have been on a summer hiatus. There is a change as summer ends and people return from vacations or simply 'a time away'—especially as once again, we worship within the walls of what we call 'our church'.

What is to be stirred up in your life in the weeks ahead? What good works are going to be taken on to help the light of Christ shine in a certain darkness? What will be stirred up at St. Paul's as this community of faith moves into the weeks and months ahead?

A last thought: such a Collect is a good one for any given day. Some may indeed wish to quietly pray it on what is now called 'The Reign of Christ Sunday' (also 'Christ the King' in some places). After all, it is still the Sunday next to Advent when so much is stirred up. Not just puddings.

WARDEN'S WALK by Betty Hooper and Paul Carpentier

A number of things have happened to the fabric of the church over the summer. Our hail damage from last August has finally been repaired. This is a good example of why we need insurance; our \$5,000 deductible is certainly easier to take than the \$54,000 cost! At the same time, we are repairing the pre-existing broken stain glass window in the hall into the church (across from the organ) at a cost of \$3,600 (plus taxes).

The church slate roof has also been repaired. There were 35 slates re-placed at a cost of app. \$3,200. It is challenging to find contractors that will still do slate, especially at that height! Our thanks go to Don Brohm for handling this task.

You will really notice the plaster repairs that were done throughout the church and hall by G & M Painting. The north wall (by the Beall windows) has been restored to its' former condition; what a difference it makes to have the windows, rather than the cracks in the wall, be the focal point! The same goes for the major bulges/cracks in the stairwells and hall. This restoration cost was approximately \$7,975 (plus tax).

We are also getting concrete repairs to the ramp door stairs, the kitchen stairs and the front porch surface of one of our Glenelg properties to the tune of \$2,100 (plus taxes).

All of these repairs have been done without dipping into our reserves. We will do the accounting to move these funds from designated to unencumbered.

We are currently reviewing our ability to get needed painting done on the upper levels of the church exterior (cap and end caps on the slate roof, the louvered tower and round windows, the frames on the two 14' yellow hall windows). At the same time the two front doors to the church have to be restored. The quote for this job is coming in around \$19,000 plus taxes. Once we have our ducks in a row on this, we will bring it before a special vestry for a vote.

There have been significant salary savings over the first 8 months of 2024. We have not paid janitorial or bookkeeping salaries since January. We thank Tom Ross for doing double duty as bookkeeper/treasurer in the interim. We welcome our new bookkeeper Megan O'Neill who started on the payroll as of August. Don and Marg Brohm continue to keep our premise spotless and we are so grateful for their commitment and generosity to our church.

We have been without a secretary since early April. Betty and myself, along with Doug Read and Lorna Green, have been filling in just to get a grasp on how much the office is used and what the appropriate hours to staff the same should be. We have decided that the office will be open Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 9:00 to noon. The office will be closed on Mondays and Fridays, but Paul C. will usually be in the building (or on the grounds) doing odd jobs if you need to get in and/or some help with something.

The goal of your wardens, and the management team, is to come to the annual vestry (Feb 2025) having done the necessary maintenance/repairs tasks to protect our buildings' soundness and facade, have a healthy cash on hand to cover operating expenses, and to not have touched the Henderson bequest. Between the salary savings that we have achieved, the Betty Michell bequest (app. \$15,000) that we have received and the Joan Powell bequest we are expecting, it is anticipated we will achieve these goals.

We welcome **Arlene Gray** as our new **Music Director and Parish Secretary** as of Tuesday September 3rd. We have been in discussion for some time now, and by combining these two functions into a part-time position we have been able to make it work for both parties. Arlene brings an amazing depth of musical talents with her skills in leading choirs (church and professional), voice lessons, playing (and teaching) of the organ and piano, playing of the bells, tuning of pianos (and limited organ tuning) and a vast number of connections in the surrounding musical community.

One only needs to see how much Arlene has on her plate to know how organized she has to be. I will be bold enough to compare her to Barb Truax (whom I never cease to be amazed at); Barb gets so many detailed items and functions to happen simultaneously and so smoothly!!! Arlene is very computer literate, detail focused and a good communicator (and listener). We believe she will excel at the caring, supportive role that the Parish Secretary plays in assisting Rev. Bonnie and the Parish in moving forward. We are so grateful Arlene has joined our staff.

A BIG THANK YOU to Muriel Kents' family for donating her last quilt to the church for a raffle. Like everything Muriel worked on, it is meticulously made and a beautiful creation. Judy and Jennifer (2 of her daughters) have made it their mission to help St. Paul's make this raffle successful and have personally sold 160 tickets (so far). WOW!! Tickets are on sale at the church and packages of ten are available for you to sign out and sell (in your complex, to your family members, to your friends). Please help us out as you are able. 

There has been a lull since Covid with fewer activities but it would be easy to recharge—it only takes a person to reserve at a restaurant and put up a sign up sheet.

ADVISORY BOARD: Because of my interest in organizations, I usually attended Advisory Board and during past years I took a turn as Board secretary and another time as Board Chair.

In February 2022 after listening to Rev. Bonnie's sermon, I talked to myself, then my husband, regarding whether I should volunteer to be Board Secretary because nobody had stepped up to be Wardens and Board secretary and chair were vacant. Lay Pastoral Visitors (by Ethel Morris)

In the Parish Profile written in 2006, it was reported that "St. Paul's has a team of approximately fifty volunteers who make pastoral visits to nursing homes, the local hospital and private homes. Our deacon will visit and provide Holy Communion to any who request it. Our deacon and lay visitors also provide a bi-weekly worship service at each of the nursing homes in the Lindsay area. Many of the residents have expressed their heartfelt gratitude to us providing these services."

Supporting and enriching these endeavours St. Paul's also provided three annual services (Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas) at the church with transportation from the nursing homes by the buses capable of carrying people in wheelchairs and walkers. A lunch was provided at the church after the service.

We are struggling to emulate this service. At present we have approximately a dozen volunteers and no deacon. We have teams to visit all but one if the nursing homes to provide worship services, sometimes bi-weekly, sometimes once a month. Hospital visitation by lay members has not been resumed, nor have the "wheelchair services" at the holiday seasons.

Both the Toronto Diocese and the Alzheimer Society have held workshops for the St. Paul's Lay Pastoral Visitors and probably would do so again if that would help volunteers feel more comfortable in this work. Meetings are brief and informal, three or four times a year over lunch or a cup of tea or coffee, to discuss any questions the visitors have. Volunteering can be as simple as helping a resident find the page number of the hymn we are to sing, or as difficult as a one-to-one visit to a lonely resident—your choice. By the way—thank you to those choir members who have joined some of the teams to help with the singing. The residents in the nursing homes have expressed their gratitude to those Lay Pastoral Visitors who are attempting to restore this opportunity for them to worship.
