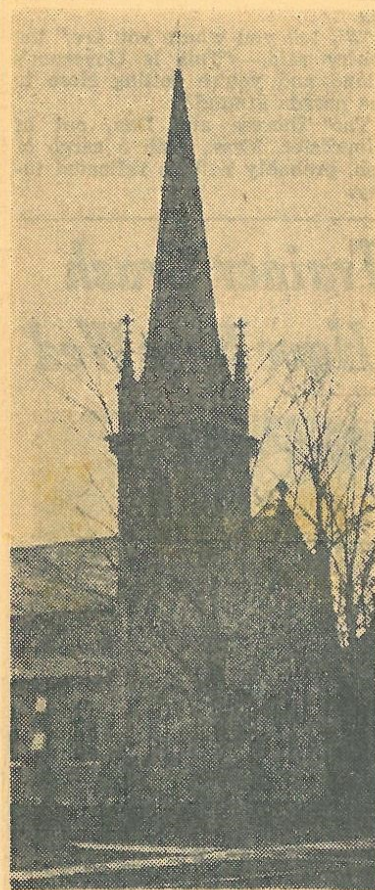


Rev. A. J. Goldring
