Ask & Imagine: Insights from your Incumbent: Rev. Bonnie Skerritt Dec. 2022



Dear Friends in Christ,

Renewal seems to be in the air lately. This is not just because we've entered into Advent, the annual time of renewal in the Church; I have also heard parishioners say that it feels like St. Paul's is coming to life again, and I have to agree with them. We have been able to have continual Sunday morning services for almost a full year uninterrupted;

we have been able to bring back some favourite events such as the Fashion Show and Strawberry Supper; we have welcomed back guest speakers; and we have had a successful stewardship campaign focused on Pre-Authorized Givings, which resulted in us almost doubling the amount of people supporting the parish this way. In a very Advent-like way, a green shoot is growing out of an old stump (Isaiah 11).

Similarly, the Diocese is beginning a time of renewal. Through a new visioning process called "Cast the Net", which we will hear more about this Winter, the Diocese is working on a way forward after spending more than two years in a pandemic which restricted the way we were able to "be the Church". The name "Cast the Net" comes from the passage at the end of the Gospel of John, when after three years of life with Jesus, the disciples find themselves trying to figure out what to do now that Jesus has been crucified and they decide to try to go back to their old ways of fishing. The resurrected Lord appears and tells them to try something different...cast your net on the other side. In his charge to Synod, Bishop Asbil said, "Our instinct, too, may be to go back to what's comfortable – what we know we're good at. But God is calling us to do things in a new way. What will happen if we cast our nets on the other side of the boat?" Certainly, words to ponder as we pray and discern where God is leading us as we approach the New Year.

My prayer for each of you this Christmas is that you will know that you are God's beloved child and that the hope, peace, joy and love that the Christ-child brings will be with you all year long.

In the church nave, volunteers have been busy putting up garlands, a tree and all manner of decorations and lights. At the top of the chancel steps stands an oak Advent candle stand and wreath, hand-crafted by the late Frank Baxter, holding the white Christ Candle. Now I can feel Christmas and am so thankful to the many volunteers whose handiwork helps inspire us at this time of year.

Your Parish Management Team, including Rev. Bonnie, has been busy over the last few months working on things, both big and small. The more significant issues:

- The hiring of a parishioner, Judy Sedgley, as our office Administrative Assistant. Most of you probably already know Judy (and Bob); be sure to drop by the office and say hi if you get a chance.
- The rewriting and reorganization of most of our tenant leases. Many were out-of-date or did not exist(!).
- The continued removal of unnecessary Warden duties. This includes the creation of a new Events Committee as events planning often fell onto the shoulders of the Wardens. We don't want any new Wardens to be bogged down with unnecessary responsibilities.
- In coordination with our two Diocesan Facilitators, Val and Susan, we hosted two "Fresh Start" sessions for all parishioners. The purpose of these sessions is to help us develop our direction as an Anglican church in Lindsay. More sessions are planned for the New Year. Come for the lunch, stay for the discussion.
- We now have an automated "hotline" for those who wish to help, place to-go orders, or require additional information regarding our Christmas Dinner, an outreach to the community. Call the church office (705) 324-4666) and press '9' when prompted.

There is always a lot going on at St. Paul's and you will find evidence of this and further details within the pages of this edition of The Grapevine. The many activities, including the week-toweek services, require the work of an extremely large group of talented volunteers. Many of you are wearing multiple hats (and some of those hats are the size of sombreros). On behalf of the Parish Management Team, I'd like to thank all of you for your continued dedicated efforts. St. Paul's could not exist without you.

CHURCH PROPERTY UPDATE

Don Brohm, Church Property Manager assisted by Ray Marshall and Don Chase

In March, June and September 2022 Grapevines we started off with some good news; so let's continue. Not one rent payment has been missed by any of our Tenants. NOW THAT'S SOME GOOD NEWS. NOW FOR THE BAD NEWS OR NOT SO GOOD NEWS.

We had the upper hall ceiling fans replaced with new ones and Tai Chi shared in the cost of this project as they rent the upper hall. Our Church roof requires further repair due to slate coming loose and we have a window frame that needs repair. We had a hot water tank in the kitchen that needed repair as the vent motor would not come on. This has been looked after. The grease trap was pumped out in September 2022.

We did not repair the outside brick high up over Russell St doors this past summer and still needs to be done. (next summer perhaps) Contractors were busy this past summer. We had a leak under the kitchen sinks that was repaired and we had to auger out the drain lines due to blockage. Our Rectory needed some repairs to cracks in the interior walls that had been repaired before (years ago) this was looked after and Midwives took care of the painting. We had to replace an old baseboard heater in the Rectory. The steps leading to the hall backdoor need some repair at the base which has been taken care of. Our boilers required two new flow switches which have been purchased but not yet installed. The fridge in the kitchen required some maintaining as a leak was found and this has been repaired.

Number 34 Glenelg St house required a new tub waste and overflow and requires a new support post in the basement due to old age. Number 36 Glenelg St house required a new toilet and drain to be augered. Number 38 Glenelg St house required a new back door lock due to old age.







Advisory Board – A Message from our Chairperson Donna Gushue

WE WANT TO THRIVE NOT JUST SURVIVE

As chairperson of the Advisory Board I decided to give you my understanding of how our church, St. Paul's is structured. "The Corporation" consists of the "incumbent" (our priest, Rev Bonnie), and in a usual time a "warden" appointed by the priest and a "warden" elected by the congregation. At St. Paul's there are also two deputy wardens. The key here is that they as the executive committee make all the decisions and are responsible financially and legally for operating our church.

The Advisory Board according to the Church "canons" or laws must have certain members e.g. The treasurer, lay member(s) to synod, and several others prescribed by the canon. But a church may also choose to add representatives from some groups in the church. The Advisory Board is there to advise the Corporation, The Advisory Board does not make the ultimate decision. But the Advisory Board Members are very important because the Corporation needs to have others from the congregation who share their knowledge and share the workload.

There are two further subjects to be considered. The first is historical where about ten years ago, there were strong feelings about a change to have voting and non-voting members of the advisory board which felt like a two-

tiered system. It changed back the next year. All members of the board have a vote. From my perspective being able to vote is not the issue. Members are not making final decisions—they only give advice. The board makes motions that request the corporation (executive committee) to look into such and such. What is needed is Advisory Board Members who are willing to help the incumbent and wardens with the work required to run the church. The executive committee can delegate tasks to advisory board members or groups or committees.


The second reason is that, although we have an Administrator who is helping our incumbent and appointed interim management committee members this year, we need to find wardens by the end of February. **WE NEED YOU**. You may want to volunteer to be considered. You may know of a person who would be good in this role. Talk to fellow parishioners and let them know that a job description with reduced tasks is being developed. There are many past wardens within the congregation who are willing to be of support. Plus there is strong support from the Advisory Board and the many groups and committees within St. Paul's. Please find out more and talk with us soon.
