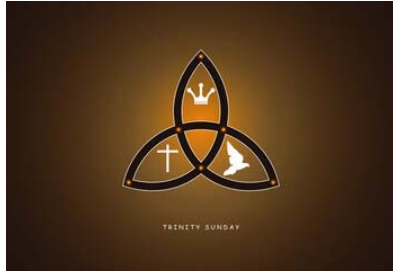

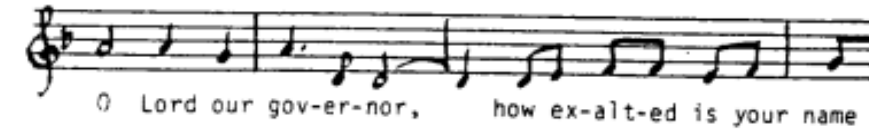
PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD

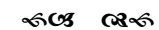
PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

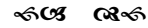
