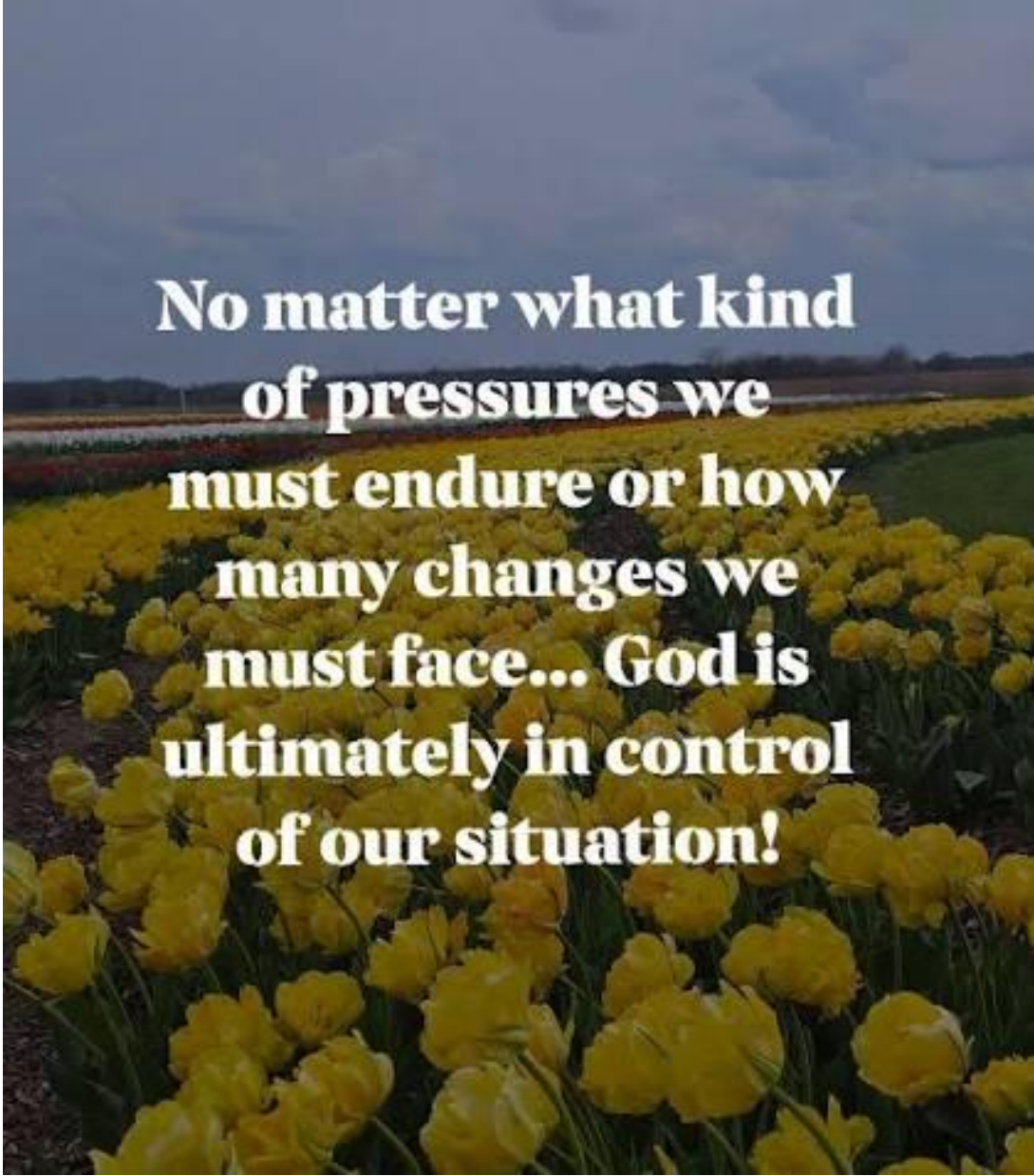

The Apostles' Creed
